



Construction Update: April 16-22, 2018

NOTE: All work is scheduled weather permitting and is subject to change without notice.

Regular construction hours are **Monday-Sunday 7 a.m.-5 p.m.** although crews may work evenings if needed.

Northbound I-25 -- traffic will be shifted to the right lane and shoulder throughout the construction zone

Southbound I-25 – **NOTE: a new Southbound I-25 off-ramp at Rio Bravo is scheduled to open north of the existing off-ramp at 8 p.m. Thursday, April 18. Please use caution and watch for signage.**

Otherwise, traffic will remain on the existing lanes north of Rio Bravo, be shifted to the inside lane and shoulder south of Rio Bravo, then be shifted back to the outside lane and shoulder farther south

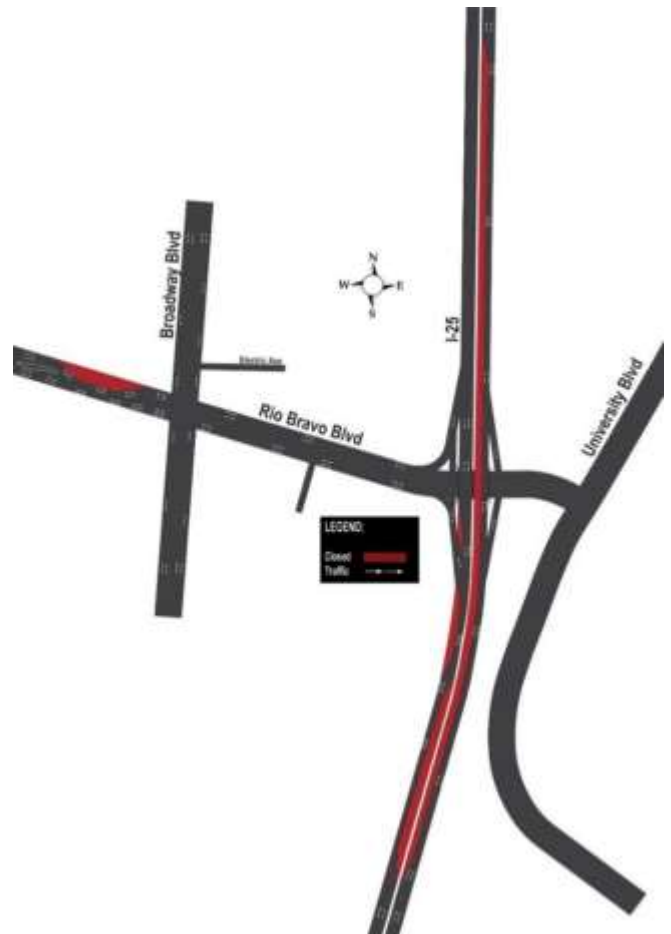
Eastbound Rio Bravo – Is on new lanes between Prince and I-25. There is a dedicated left turn lane for eastbound traffic to turn north on Broadway.

Westbound Rio Bravo – Is on new lanes between Prince and I-25. There is a dedicated left turn lane for westbound traffic to turn south on Broadway.

NOTE: *There are also traffic restrictions and lane reductions on northbound and southbound Broadway near the Rio Bravo intersection.*

Electric Avenue – There is no access to Electric Avenue from southbound Broadway

NIGHT WORK: From **8 p.m. Sunday, April 15** through **5:30 a.m. Monday, April 16**, **the right lane of westbound Rio Bravo will be closed from just east of Broadway to east of the South Diversion Bridge.** Motorists traveling westbound on Rio Bravo in this area should expect delays.



SPEED LIMITS ARE REDUCED IN THE CONSTRUCTION ZONE.

NOTE: The multi-use path is closed about 400 feet west of the intersection of Broadway and Rio Bravo for safety for the duration of the project.

Motorists should expect delays, particularly during morning and afternoon commutes or nighttime work, obey reduced speeds in the construction zone and watch for construction signs.
